From a 'Dusty corner' ---- Scholarship Fund Initiated

Rarely are young people of today interested in the theatre pipe organ. But when one comes along, I believe it is up to us to support them in any way we can. For example, we can invite them to meetings. We can encourage them to come out for Open Console. And we can give them an opportunity to play a short "showcase."

One very unique opportunity is the Youth Summer Camp run by our parent organization, ATOS. This week-long program features nationally recognized organists and technicians as instructors, coaches and mentors along with

opportunities to learn about and play some of the largest and finest instruments in the country. Tuition for the ATOS Youth Summer Camp is only \$295. Total cost including air fare and hotel for someone from this area will be about \$1,500.

Through one of our former members, we have discovered a young man from Lancaster County who has extraordinary talent on the keyboard and whom we have encouraged to explore the theatre organ. Some of you heard him at our March meeting. His name is Conner Ream and he has applied for a scholarship to the ATOS Summer Camp.

To fund a scholarship for Conner and any others who qualify, we have set up a Scholarship Fund within our treasury. Non-Profit Status Granted!

SVTOS has reached a major milestone in the history of the club: Non-profit status under Section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code. And a huge THANK YOU to Larry Fenner who headed up the long and involved process and to Barry Howard and others who helped along the way.

What did it take to get here? Well, start with filing a fictitious name with the State of Pennsylvania. Then revising our By-Laws and drafting Articles of Incorporation and filing them with the state so we could become incorporated. Then completing and filing the application with the IRS and responding to their requests changes. It was a really big job.

What does it mean? A lot!! We can now solicit sponsors for public concerts and they will be able to deduct their contributions. Members and other individuals can make tax-deductible contributions to the club and/or to our scholarship program. Members who serve as officers and other volunteers can deduct some of their expenses. And non-profit status improves our standing with the Strand-Capitol Performing Arts Center.

Now it's up to you. Consider how you might support SVTOS through your tax-deductible contribution, by soliciting sponsors or by including SVTOS in your will. Funds raised will help the club in its mission to "preserve and present" the theatre pipe organ not just to our own members but to all in our area.

Attention Voting Members

Two events have made it necessary to make some technical changes to our By-Laws. First is our incorporation in Pennsylvania and our application for non-profit status. In addition, we changed from a calendar year to a program year (September to August).

The following two changes are submitted to you for your consideration. They will be formally presented voted upon **at our April meeting**.

Section 2. Organization

S.V.T.O.S. is registered as a Nonprofit Corporation under the Nonprofit Corporation Law of 1988 in the state of Pennsylvania, and has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

Section 1. Annual Meetings

The first Annual Meeting of the S.V.T.O.S. shall be held in October 1993 at a time and place to be set by the Officers. The preferred calendar date of ensuing S.V.T.O.S. Annual Meetings shall be in May of each year, or whenever scheduling can be arranged. The day, time and place will be determined by the Officers.
