John Lauter Showcase



The Michigan Theatre in Ann Arbor, MI, featured John as staff organist for 17 years, during which John accompanied such silent film classics as "Metropolis," "The Birth of a Nation," "The Phantom of the Opera," "It," "Robin Hood," "Greed," "The Big Parade," "Nosferatu," "The Gold Rush," and many others.

The Detroit Fox Theatre's 1988 grand re-opening found John playing before "The Ultimate Event," featuring Liza Minnelli, Sammy Davis Jr., and Frank Sinatra.

In preparation for the opening of their new IMAX theatre, the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn contracted John to compose and record a silent film accompaniment to a silent film collage featured in a specially produced IMAX short subject shown before each feature there.

In February 2010 John was a musical guest on NPR's popular "Prairie Home Companion" program. Host Garrison Keillor remarked "the man (Lauter) has unerring good taste." Lauter performed solos on the live broadcast and joined forces with PHC's "guys all-star shoe band" for some numbers. The show was performed live before 5,000 people and broadcast live into 4 million homes.

Larry Fenner and Barry Howard report that they had also an exceptional experience this summerat the ATOS Technical Experience in Zanesville, Ohio. There were both classroom and workshop sessions. Topics included handling and cleaning pipes, remedial repairs, tuning basics, winding for reliable tremulants, and much more. Check their web site, <u>www.Opus501.com</u>, for more. Whenever serious theatre pipe organ enthusiasts get together there is likely to be lively discussion of the merits of "modernizing" an instrument—like replacing the electropneumatic relays or adding ranks of pipes



from other instruments. It's a little like the folks who work on old cars—some try to make them just like they came off the assembly line and others turn them into great looking hot rods.

During his presentation at our September meeting Jeff Weiler pointed out that out of the over 2000 pipe organs that Wurlitzer manufactured, there are only 11 left in their original condition. Jeff feels that regardless of how much one enjoys the sound of "modernized" instruments, we need to figure out a way to preserve some or all of those 11. Otherwise, there may come a time when we will have nothing except pictures to see how they were originally built.
