



H. Edward "Eddie" Yeagley 72, of Willow Street, PA, passed away at his home on Friday following an unexpected illness. He was the son of the late Edward R. Yeagley, who passed away in 1997, and Hazel Martin Yeagley of Quarryville, PA.

Eddie had graduated from Lampeter-Strasburg High School in 1957 and had worked for ACME Markets for 36 years until he retired in the early 1990's as the night manager at the Thorndale, PA store, and had received many customer



Eddie had a gift for music, and was self-taught on playing the organ. He played for his church, New Providence Church of God, Rocky Springs, Maple Grove and Overlook Roller Rinks, also for various concerts in York and Delaware, and also at the Willow Valley Retirement Communities. He was a member of the Dickinson Theatre Organ Society along with many other organist societies. He enjoyed being a Ham radio operator, fishing with his cousin, Ron; and was also an avid Philadelphia Phillies fan.

He will be lovingly remembered by his mother, Hazel, several cousins and by his many friends. He was preceded in death by his sister, Rebecca Yeagley, who passed away in 1994. 
