

#### George Wright at the Kearns Wurlitzer

In 1957 while under contract to Hi Fi Records, George Wright recorded two albums for RCA Victor's budget label, Camden Records. These were made at the beautifully voiced, former Warner Bros., studio Wurlitzer at the home of veteran radio and television actor Joseph Kearns. Beautifully played and long unavailable. From mint condition copies!

#### Leon Berry: His First and Rarest Recordings Vol 1 & 2

There was never a better, or more well loved skating rink organist than Leon Berry. These recordings predate his later Audio Fidelity albums and were made on state-of-the-art equipment, transferred from mint condition and unplayed copies.
