He is currently serving as Minister of Music at Brown Memorial Park Avenue Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, MD and is also on the faculty at the Community College of Baltimore County.

Our November program will be at the Allen Theatre in Annville, PA and will feature Don Kinnier accompanying a Silent movie — "College" starring Buster Keaton. This program will be on Sunday afternoon November 10th at 1:30PM and will also be open to the general public. SVTOS members will get in FREE with their membership badge. Come early and enjoy lunch at MJ'S Coffeehouse which is adjacent to the theatre.

We have two more showcases in the coming months with two great organists. In March, young organist, Dan Minervini, from New York will be our guest organist. Dan was named ATOS Theatre Organ Student of the Year for 2013. Dan is a student of Jelani Eddington and was a finalist at the 2013 ATOS Young Organist Competition in Atlanta, GA. He is also serving as the Youth Representative to the ATOS Board of Directors.

In June, we were finally able to get Bob Eyer from Chambersburg as our guest organist. Bob recently retired from Chambersburg High School where he was a music teacher and choral director. He continues as Director of Music at Trinity Lutheran Church in Chambersburg where he is organist and senior choir director. Bob is equally talented in both classical and theatre organ music and is the house organist for the Capitol Theatre in Chambersburg.

We are unfortunately losing two of our members due to a move out of state. Dusty and Barbara Miller will be moving to Edmond, Oklahoma sometime in October. We are sad to be losing them since they have been good friends and active members in SVTOS for many years. 

On Friday, November 22 at 7:00 p.m., Organist **Don Kinnier** will accompany *Steamboat Bill, Jr.*, a 1928 comedy silent film featuring Buster Keaton, at Jerusalem Lutheran Church, 36 Church Street, in Rothsville, PA (Lancaster County). Don is a regular performer at Longwood Gardens and has been called "the premier silent film accompanist in the northeastern United States." He has appeared at The Philadelphia Museum of Art, The Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and numerous venues as far south as Argentina. The instrument is a combination Moeller/Walker (digitally sampled Aeolian-Skinner voices). A free-will offering will be received. The church is handicap accessible.

MICHAEL T. BRITT, a Baltimore native, began piano studies with Gwendolyn Logston. At age 12, Michael entered the Peabody Preparatory School where he studied piano with Joyze Sutherland, James Warthen and organ with Gretchen Benchoff. In 1979 Michael entered the Peabody Conservatory of Music where he studied organ with Dr. Paul L. Davis and Improvisation/Sacred Music with Arthur Rhea. He graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Organ Performance having been the recipient of the Richard L. Phelps Award and a three-time recipient of the Richard Ross Award for organ. In 1980, Michael became the Associate Organist at the Shrine of the Little Flower and in 1981, was appointed Minister of Music where he served for nearly 26 years. In 1984 Michael was a finalist in the Arthur Poister competition in Syracuse, New York. Further studies have been with Thomas Spacht, Donald Sutherland, John Rose and John Walker.

As well as being a frequent recitalist of classical organ literature, Michael is a performer of theatre organ music and is in demand throughout the country as a silent film accompanist, performing for chapters of the American Theatre Organ Society and most recently, for the Region III-American Guild of Organists Convention in Baltimore. He has been featured on Maryland Public Television and other televised presentations on the theatre pipe organ and Maryland's Free State Theatre Organ Society. In 1998, Michael was invited to perform at Baltimore's Senator Theatre where he accompanied five silent films for the National Film Registry Tour, which was sponsored in part by the Library of Congress. Mr. Britt has also performed at the Palace Theatre in Cleveland, Ohio; The Paramount Theatre in Anderson, Indiana; The Byrd Theatre in Richmond, Virginia as well as yearly performances at the Capitol Theatre in Chambersburg, Pennsylvania. In 2002, Michael was invited to perform a series of concerts on the recently restored Aeolian pipe organ installed at the Mexican Cultural Institute in Washington, D.C. In 2005, Michael was invited to Princeton University to accompany the silent film classic, "Phantom of the Opera" at the University Chapel where recently, he completed his sixth performance of this annual event.

In May of 2009, Michael gave a recital on the great Cavaille-Coll organ at the Cathedral of Notre-Dame in Paris and studied organ at the Conservatory with Marie-Louise Langlais.

In his career as a sacred musician, Michael has been active in commissioning new music for organ, choir and congregation. He was one of the founders of the Baltimore Archdiocesan Choir and served as Co-Director for four years.

In June of 2012, Michael was appointed Minister of Music and organist at Brown Memorial Park Avenue Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, Maryland. He is also on the faculty at the Community College of Baltimore County and serves as Assistant Organist at Beth-El Congregation.


