## MONDAY, APRIL 10TH AT 7:00 PM CAPITOL THEATRE, YORK, PA



Frank Vanaman was born and raised in Washington, DC, and now makes his home north of Baltimore, MD. He earned an engineering degree from the University of Maryland and is currently employed by the Federal Government doing wholly un-musical work.

Frank will be the first person to tell you that his official musical studies total nothing beyond a few months of beginning piano several decades ago and some choral work in his high-school years. Rather, he is unabashedly an ear player. His focus in organ playing relies upon a great appreciation for a traditional theatre organ style with a substantial helping of slightly more modern jazz-based harmonies and improvisations added to the mix.

Frank is also a wood-worker and an enthusiast of both synthesizer DIY building and the playing of experimental improvised electronic music.

SVTOS is a 501(c)(3) corporation dedicated to the preservation and presentation of Theatre Pipe Organs. Proudly supporting the Mighty WurliTzer Theatre Pipe Organ at the Capitol Theatre in York, PA.

I have some sad news to report on the passing of former SVTOS member Glenn Thompson. Glenn passed away on Saturday March 18th at Lancaster Care and Rehab Center. Glenn worked on the initial installation of the Capitol Organ and was very active in the club in its early years. He suffered a number of health problems and as result has not been active in the theatre organ world in recent years but the theatre organ remained one of his first loves.

June 12<sup>th</sup> is our final showcase for this season and will feature guest organist Gary Phillips from Attleboro, MA. This will be Gary's first time playing for SVTOS and we look forward to hearing him.
