

From Don Kinnier -- Two Great Collections of Silent Films Available:

Edison: The Invention of the Movies is a 4 DVD set which chronicles Edison's work from its very beginnings in 1889 (yes 1889) to 1918. The films are all accompanied. Some on piano by Ben Model (who does a sterling performance), some by other piano players who do a 'starling' job, and mercifully some on theatre organ with Clark Wilson who does fairly fine filmic accompaniment. For the film buff this is a great collection.

The second set, or actually two sets, are *Gaumont Treasures 1897 - 1913* and *Gaumont Treasures Vol. 2 1908-1916*. The Gaumonts are three DVD sets and are marvelous. They show how far advanced the French film makers were compared with us, and many of the films are accompanied by a full theatre orchestra playing stunningly appropriate music even for the short films. Those that are not accompanied by the orchestra have either piano or small ensemble accompaniment, also very well played. These DVDs are a great addition to any movie collection.
