DONNIE RANKIN

Monday, September 12th at 7:00 PM Capitol Theatre, York, PA

Donnie Rankin first took an interest in the theatre organ at the tender age of three when he first heard the sounds of the Mighty Wurlitzer at the Civic Theatre in Akron, Ohio. Following that initial introduction to the King of Instruments, he frequently played on his great-grandfather's home organ. In 2000 Donnie acquired an instrument and began taking formal lessons. Classical piano training followed in 2005, and his budding talent quickly blossomed into first rate musicianship.



Since then, Donnie has won several organ competitions and awards, including being named the Overall Winner of the American Theatre Organ Society's Young Theatre Organist Competition in 2007.

Donnie began studying with noted organist Jelani Eddington in September 2007. Since that time, Donnie has performed for theatre organ audiences around the world. He resides in Ravenna, Ohio, and is a staff organist at the Civic Theatre in nearby Akron – the very same organ Donnie first heard when he was three years old.

SVTOS is a 501(c)(3) corporation dedicated to the preservation and presentation of Theatre Pipe Organs. Proudly supporting the Mighty WurliTzer Theatre Pipe Organ at the Capitol Theatre in York, PA.

The ATOS Convention in Cleveland during the first week of July was attended by 9 members of SVTOS who were privileged to hear 12 great organists play 12 great theatre pipe organs in marvelous movie palaces, auditoriums, and even a car museum! Five of the organists at the convention previously performed for SVTOS, and this year we are pleased to have Donnie Rankin, an additional convention artist, as our first showcase artist on September 12th at the Capitol Theatre in York. We're looking forward to hearing Donnie play the Capitol Wurlitzer. See more information about Donnie on page 1 of *The Windline*. Revisions to the SVTOS By-Laws will also be introduced at the September 12th meeting. Congratulations to Cody McSherry, our youngest member, for winning the "Lancaster's Got Talent" contest. Cody played several advanced accordion selections and won over all 3 judges. Cody plays several musical instruments, including the organ, and has a bright future as a musician.

On a sad note, Louis Appell, Jr., a passionate supporter of the arts, passed away in June. He was a major contributor to the Strand Capitol Performing Arts Center and various other non-profit organizations. While he was not a member of SVTOS, he did support SVTOS and the installation of the organ.

The Capitol Theatre has scheduled more movies for September and is planning to have regular Saturday evening movies proceeded by 30 minutes of organ music. Our SVTOS organists have stepped up to provide the walk-in music prior to the movies. As more movies are scheduled we will be looking for additional organists for these movies.

Don Kinnier will also be accompanying two more silent films at the Capitol Theatre that will be open to the public. The "Halloween" program will be on Saturday October 29th and will feature the silent film *Nosferatu*. The "Christmas" program will be on Sunday December 11th and will feature the Laurel and Hardy comedy *Big Business* and two other short silent films.

Our September meeting marks the start of our new 2016-2017 Season featuring three new organists. The start of a new season also means that membership dues are payable. Please see page 7 of *The Windline* for the membership renewal form.

NOTICE TO SVTOS MEMBERSHIP: Proposed amendments to the SVTOS By-Laws:

As required by the SVTOS by-laws, the following amendments to the by-laws will be proposed at the SVTOS September 12th meeting and will be acted on at the SVTOS November 10th meeting (by-laws require 30 days after proposal, so the October 10th meeting will be too soon to act). The following is the original text of the by-laws showing the proposed changes in red:

ARTICLE III Membership

Section 2. Classes and Benefits of Membership

There shall be two three classes of membership: Regular, Associate, and Honorary.

Each Regular member shall have the right to participate in all S.V.T.O.S. activities, including Showcase meetings, clinics, workshops, open consoles, annual picnic, and field trips, etc.; shall receive two guest passes per year; shall be provided with free admission for any child or student under 18 years of age when accompanied by the Regular Member; shall receive all S.V.T.O.S. bulletins and publications; and shall have the right to vote on any matter requiring membership approval in accordance with these By-laws. Regular members who are also members of A.T.O.S. shall have the right to hold office.

Each Associate member shall have the right to participate in all S.V.T.O.S. clinics, workshops, open consoles, annual picnic, and field trips; and shall receive all S.V.T.O.S. bulletins and publications. Associate members who are also members of A.T.O.S. shall have the right to vote on any matter requiring membership approval in accordance with these By-laws.

Any person who has rendered outstanding service to the S.V.T.O.S. over a period of time, or who is a resident of the S.V.T.O.S. area of operation and has made a substantial contribution to the advancement or history of the theatre organ, may be elected as Honorary Member by nomination of any active member and majority vote of the membership present at the Annual Meeting. Honorary Members shall have no local voting privileges and shall pay no S.V.T.O.S. dues. S.V.T.O.S. shall pay national dues in the A.T.O.S. for one year for such honorary members.

ARTICLE IV Officers

Section 1. Election and Term of Office

The Officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. At least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Meeting, the Officers shall appoint a Nominating Committee consisting of at least two (2) three (3) Regular members who are not current Officers. At least thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Meeting, the Nominating Committee shall publish and distribute to all members a proposed slate of Officers. Additional nominations may be made by motion of any eligible member at the Annual Meeting, provided at least two (2) eligible members second said nomination. Election of Officers shall be by simple majority of eligible members present and voting at the Annual Meeting. No officer shall serve in one (1) office for more than two (2) consecutive terms, except the Treasurer, who has no term limit.
