Rich has performed concerts and recitals in the United States and Canada, including two ATOS National Conventions and a Regional Convention of the American Guild of Organists.

For four years, Rich held the post of Associate Organist at the Ohio Theatre, Columbus, Ohio, where he performed regularly alongside Clark Wilson on the Ohio's Robert Morton organ.

Rich has also been honored with an extended engagement at the famous Chicago Theatre, Chicago, where he performed daily on the Wurlitzer organ.

Other notable concert appearances have included the Detroit Theatre Organ Society, Rochester Theatre Or-

gan Society, Shea's Buffalo Theatre, and Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square, PA.

From a 'Dusty corner'

Most people think that meetings are dull and boring. I guess I must be different. I've had a number of very worthwhile meetings in the last month. Permit me to give you a brief overview.

I continue to be so very grateful for the leadership team of SVTOS. At our September meeting (held on the campus of Masonic Village in Elizabethtown) Treasurer, Emmitte Miller, reported a checkbook balance of nearly \$4,000. Gary Coller outlined program ideas for the season. Herb Inge reported our membership statistics and Larry Fenner updated us on



progress toward becoming a non-profit organization. Following our discussion we adjourned to the Health Center where Don Kinnier entertained residents with a Buster Keaton classic. Thank you all.

Later in the month I had the pleasure of lunch outside Philadelphia with ATOS President and CEO, Ken Double. I described our many activities -- playing walk-in music for the classic movies, showcase meetings and clinics, entertaining at nursing homes -- and I expressed my concern that we have been financially unable to present a public concert. He was very reassuring that we are doing our best to "preserve and present" the theatre pipe organ and that becoming a non-profit will open up many new avenues for raising money for public concerts.

While in York for the October Special extended open console event I took the opportunity to meet with the interim CEO of the Strand-Capitol Performing Arts Center, Suzanne McConkey. She seemed genuinely interested in the organ and in the SVTOS. She welcomed my ideas for collaboration and asked probing questions about the instrument and the organization. I'm confident we will continue to enjoy an excellent relationship with the theatre management.

I have an Allen analog T-15 self-contained 2 61note manuals and 32 pedals with the usual flutes and real reeds and some strings. It is free to a 'good home'.

It has an internal Gyrophonic projector (Allens answer to the Leslie) so it does have some schlurpy Tibias. It is a straight console not a theater organ. Nice for a practice instrument or for a small meeting room.

VISIT TO HEITZ RESIDENCE

While listening to the unique sounds of the theatre pipe organ in a huge theatre is exciting, hearing one in the intimate surroundings of a beautiful home is a pleasure all its own. That's what about a dozen members and guests received when they traveled to the home of Nina Heitz near New Hope to hear and play the 3/23 mostly Wurlitzer pipe organ installed in her music room.

Beginning around noon, playing members took advantage of open console. Shortly after 2:00, Ralph Ringstad, Jr. from New Jersey entertained with many upbeat songs from the 30's. We were even treated to an impromptu duet featuring the organ and a beautiful grand piano in the same room.

The organ console is housed in a "garage" in one end of the room surrounded by one of the two organ

chambers. The other chamber is in a overhead space opposite the console. Listeners were literally surrounded by the magnificent sounds of the instrument.

The group ordered in pizza for lunch to which Nina graciously added salads and dessert served buffet style in her elegant dining room.

PETER RICHARD CONTE, in concert



Peter Richard Conte is Grand Court Organist of the world famous Wanamaker Organ at the Macy's Philadelphia department store. When not touring, he performs on the six-manual, 28,000-pipe instrument twice daily, six days per week. The Wanamaker Organ is the largest fully functioning musical instrument in the world;

Mr. Conte was appointed Grand Court Organist in 1989, and is the fourth person to hold that title since the organ first played in 1911.

DISCOUNT ON CAPITOL MOVIES


You can attend the films for \$5. The normal fee is \$8 unless you have an annual membership (\$30). They only have to show their SVTOS membership badge.

Meters end the day at 6:30 PM, so you can park free along the street for our Capitol Events. Depending on what else is going on downtown, you may have to pay at the parking garage.


You Asked For It:
