As always we ask members to bring the necessary side dishes.



For Open Console, we'll have an instrument in the fellowship hall with access to 17 different Hauptwerk organs. Including Wurlitzer, Barton, Compton, Cavaille-Coll, Henry Willis and Wangerin.



We'll also be able to use the church's organ, a 1923 2/11 Möller, opus 3277. It has the heart of a Theatre Organ and the new console by R. J. Brunner & Co has a midi system that allows the instrument to control various Hauptwerk digital organs too. (Wahoo!!!!)
We also have a Baldwin Concert Grand in the Sanctuary for duets.
The Möller's 11 ranks are as follows:
Gedeckt (very tibia like), Viol Dolce,
Viole d'orchestra, VDO Celeste, Flauto Traverso (orchestral flute)
Trumpet, Oboe, Vox Humana, Open Diapason, Principal, Mixture III

His command of the theatre organ was truly remarkable and indicative of much older organists. He was a finalist at last year's Young Theatre Organist Competition in Los Angeles and will compete again at this year's ATOS convention in Atlanta. Justin's performance was exciting and he received glowing comments from everyone in attendance. He will be a rising young star in the theatre organ world.

It was a real pleasure to work with both Mark and Justin. They are both extremely talented young men and hope we can do it again sometime in the future.

I am pleased to announce that Don, Judy and Bella have generously agreed to donate their custom digital theatre organ to SVTOS (photos page 7). It is agreed that the organ will remain in the Allen Theatre in Annville, PA, as long as both parties want it to remain there. In the event that the Allen Theatre no longer wants the organ in the theatre, it may be removed by SVTOS. We have received a donation from one of our members to upgrade the organ and get it licensed for public use. This will allow the organ to be used for concerts, silent movies, etc and open to the general public. Skip Hicks, the owner of the theatre, is delighted with the organ and we look forward to working with him on future programs. The organ will be known as the "Bobby Lilarose Memorial Organ" since he originally rescued the organ and made it available for future use. We thank Don, Judy and Bella for their contribution, which gives us another venue for SVTOS.

I want to thank everyone on the leadership committee and other members who helped to make this a memorable and successful season. Our schedule of programs for next season is almost complete and will be announced in the August newsletter.


