# PIERRE FRACALANZA SHOWCASE FROM HEART TO RODGERS AND HART,

# MONDAY, JUNE 9TH, 7:00 PM CAPITOL THEATRE, YORK, PA

**PIERRE FRACALANZA** returns to play for SVTOS after his public concert in April 2019.

As an accomplished theatre organist, pianist, and vocal entertainer, he's performed for audiences across the United States and Canada. His introduction to theatre organ took place in Pontiac, Michigan where he became a staff organist for Theatre Organ Pizza and Pipes. Pierre's love of organ continued after that as a product specialist for electronic organ brands such as Rodgers, Hammond, Wurlitzer, Lowrey and Yamaha. He also did extensive work showcasing reproducing pianos from Yamaha and PianoDisc. But it was the Hauptwerk virtual pipe organ that piqued Pierre's curiosity in returning to theatre organ.



Hoping to add a touch of organ to his piano/vocal concerts, he gained attention doing a tribute to the late Buddy Cole at the 2014 ATOS Convention.

Among his various accomplishments, Pierre has "opened" for Carol Channing and played for celebrities of all sorts including then First Lady Hilary Rodham Clinton and the late Senator Ted Kennedy. In 2012, Pierre was added to the roster of Steinway Artists and in 2019 he was named the ATOS "Organist of the Year".

Pierre retired from his Catholic Church Job after 30 years this past January. In that long tenure, he estimates he played a great deal of organ - some five hundred weddings, a thousand funerals and a whopping ten thousand services! One might say he's quite familiar with "sitting on the bench."

Among his favorite hobbies are 3D and VR and AR technologies. But most of all, he loves audiences and sharing the magic of music.
