Tim Schramm is a native of Rochester, NY. He started playing the piano at the age of 6. At the age of 10 he was introduced to the Mighty Wurlitzer at the Auditorium Theatre in Rochester and it was love at first sight. Since that time the organ has become his passion. He played

his first church service at the age of 11. Since then he continues to play church services, weddings, funerals, organ dedications and theatre organ concerts. He has never had any formal organ lessons.

While living in Buffalo Tim became involved with the Buffalo area Chapter of the American Theatre Organ Society. He is one of their past Presidents. He was the unofficial House Organist for the Shea's Buffalo Center for the Performing Arts where he played their 4/29 Wurlitzer.

Mr. Schramm had been in the piano and organ business for almost 25 years specializing in church organ installations. He has since left retail altogether and now makes his living as a full time musician. He is currently an Accompanist for the Rochester City School District and Artist in Residence and Director of Music Ministries at Wesley United Methodist Church in Rochester.



Longwood Gardens Organ Update


